The process of cleaning out my parent's home feels like an archeological dig. We have found things that have caused us to remember, both with laughter and tears. We have found things we have forgotten about. We have found things we didn't know about that have taught us about our parents. And we have found stuff that frankly we don't know what it is, where it is from or why we have it! But we have had to figure out what to do with each and every item!

Digging into scripture is just like this. There is much we are familiar with. Some we can't remember even hearing before. And some that makes us wonder why in the world it is in in the Bible anyway? But we have to deal with each and every piece.

It would be nice if we could just focus on the scripture passages that inspire us and ignore the ones that confuse us or make us feel uncomfortable. However, 2 Timothy 3: 16-17 reminds us, "All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work."

We can't pick and choose. We can only keep digging, asking the Holy Spirit for wisdom to understand how God is speaking to us. It is then, and only then, that we can start to make sense of God's story of amazing grace as contained in both the Old and the New Testament.

To help with that archeological dig into scripture, I have been asked to start a class called, "Bible 101", so we can work together to dig into scripture to find God's wisdom for us. This class will be a place for you to ask your questions and find the connection between scripture and our daily lives. We will answer basic questions. (What is a gentile anyway? *Anyone who isn't Jewish.*) And we will struggle together to figure out what the dimensions of the Tabernacle have to do with our lives today. (You'll have to come to class for the answer to that one!)

In order to schedule this class, I need to know who might be interested, so we can schedule a convenient time for all of us. Emma Wright, the missionary we help support though the "Remember Nhu" Mission Minute, will be speaking at our church January 27th on her ministry experiences of working with children of the "Remember Nhu" program in Cambodia·

Children live in the program's residential property to avoid the sex trafficking trade and the missionaries help them learn English and teach them about God's love. There are many success stories of girls learning their own tribal language along with English, so they are able to become self-sustaining and safe from the traffickers.

Emma is asking that we help her build a library of books for her students. She is looking for new or gently used books for children 10 and under. There is a basket in fellowship hall to collect the books. They will be shipped sometime in February so let's continue to show our love and support to Emma and "Remember Nhu".

The United Methodist Church: Looking for a way forward

The Commission on a Way Forward was proposed by the Council of Bishops and approved by the 2016 General Conference to do a complete examination and possible revision of every paragraph of the Book of Discipline concerning human sexuality and explore options that help to maintain and strengthen the unity of the church.

Rather than making one proposal, the commission has developed three different proposal for the church to consider. There will be a special session of General Conference in February 2019 to explore and possibly adopt one of these proposals.

Since the commission's report is 93 pages long, I will not attempt to sum it up in just a few words. However, I do encourage you to look at some of the resources and become familiar with what is happening and what it might mean for us in the near future.

In addition, you will receive along with this month's newsletter, a PDF developed by the Great Plains Annual Conference that offers a thumbnail sketch of each plan and its implications for the church on a number of levels.
